3004	<p><b>PLANNING APPLICATIONS</b></p> <p><i>Cllr Oakley withdrew from the meeting</i></p> <p>TG/14/02919/FUL Tangmere Military Aviation Museum. Erection of Storage Structure</p> <p>This had been considered at a meeting of the Environment Committee the previous week, but had been deferred pending further information. [Prior to this meeting, members had received a pre-meeting briefing from Mr Dudley Hooley, a Director of the Tangmere Military Aviation Museum. He assured members that the current application for a new storage/maintenance facility was urgently required to enable them to protect artefacts, and could be moved if necessary, should the site be required to provide access to land to the rear, should that become available to the Museum. Expansion plans, by way of the Neighbourhood Plan or otherwise may be many years off, and the artefacts could not wait until them.]</p> <p>RESOLVED: NO OBJECTION</p> <p><i>Cllr Oakley re-joined the meeting</i></p>	
3005	<p><b>TANGMERE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN</b></p> <p><b>3005.1</b> The Chairman, Cllr Irwin explained that as a result of many months of hard work, including numerous revisions to reflect the views of many stakeholders, the draft NP was at a point where it could go out for public consultation, the so-called Pre-Submission Consultation, for the community's views, prior to it being submitted to CDC. Cllr Irwin had called the meeting</p>

	so that the Parish Council could have a final view on it and confirm that it was happy for it to go forward.	
<b>3005.2</b>	The meeting was then adjourned for members of the public to make comment.	
<b>3005.3</b>	Councillors echoed several public comments that certain elements, as they appeared in the document, may lead to misunderstandings about what was being proposed and a possible feeling from residents that their original views had all been ignored. The Chairman said he understood the concerns, but the consultants had advised that the content as drafted would enable the village to obtain the very best possible outcome from the process. There was also a danger that delaying the start of the six-week pre-submission consultation, would mean that developers would <i>pip the Parish to the post</i> in terms of getting planning applications in before the Draft NP had been deposited with CDC, giving them a possible <i>edge</i> .	
<b>3005.4</b>	It was RESOLVED that the Council make no further amendment to the Plan, concurring that it was a suitable document to consult residents upon, but that its contents in no way reflected the official view or otherwise of the Council.
